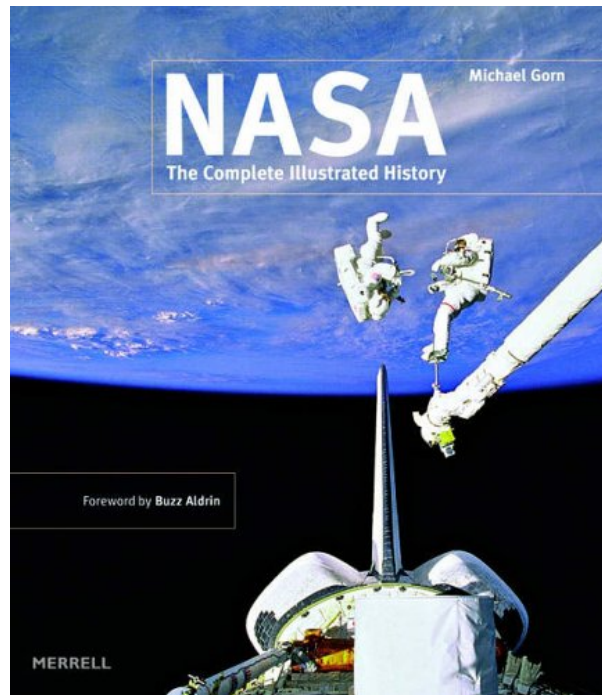


NASA: THE COMPLETE ILLUSTRATED HISTORY BY MICHAEL H. GORN
